

Directions to the United Free Church, Leytonstone
55 Wallwood Road Leytonstone, London, E11 1AY

The church building is on the corner of Wallwood Road and Fairlop Road. Main entrance on Wallwood Road. There is parking at the church and street parking too.

London Underground: Leytonstone is on the Central Line



From Leytonstone station: if walking, **exit right** out of the booking office - the walk to the church is a gentle uphill and takes a maximum of 10 minutes.

If catching a bus at the station: the bus stops are on the **left** - buses W15, W16, & W19 all go past the church - 2 stops on the bus.

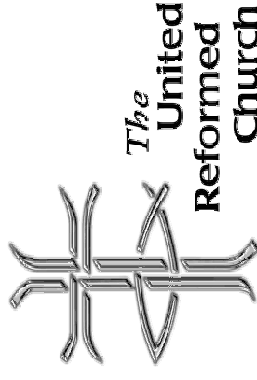

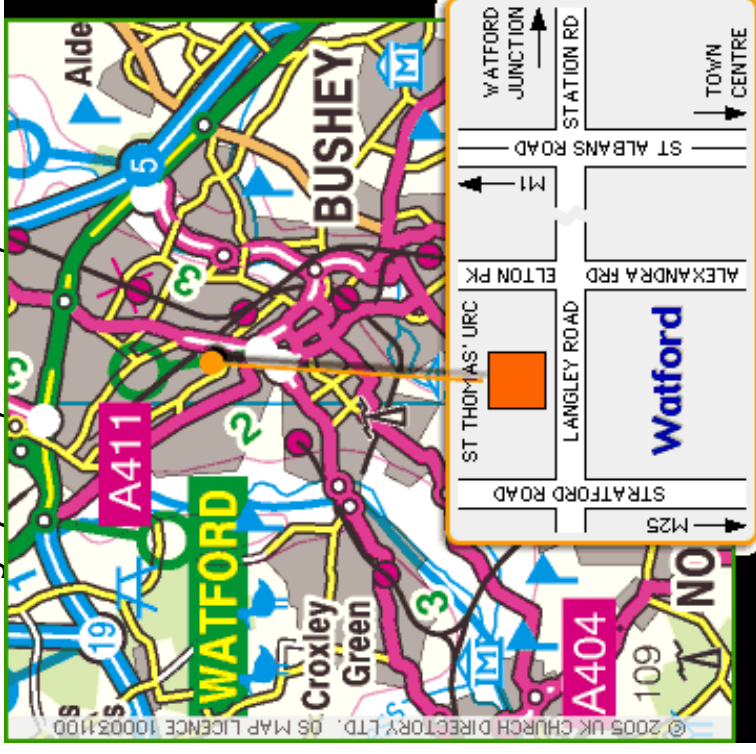

British Rail: Watford Junction

Trains from London Euston—journey time approx. 20 mins. Turn right out of the station into Station Road, cross St. Albans Road at the traffic lights and continue up Langley Road – a gentle up hill to St. Thomas' on your right.

London Underground: Metropolitan Line to Watford

—taxi's from Station

By Car: From M25 north Junction 20; From M25 west Junction 19; From M1 Junctions 5 or 6

(Unless you are familiar with Watford, avoid the St. Albans Rd. (A412) and aim for the roundabout at the north end of Hempstead Rd.(A411), drive south to traffic light and left into Langley Rd.) There is a large car park at the rear of the church or park in Stratford Road—however please be aware that the parking in neighbouring streets is limited by yellow lines and “residents only” parking bays.
