Morna Hooker was Lady Margaret's Professor of Divinity at Cambridge from 1976-1998 and is a Life Fellow of Robinson College. The author or editor of 18 books on Paul and the Gospels she has been a speaker at Greenbelt and is a Methodist Local Preacher.
